New mission in South Sudan calls for peace and reconciliation

Won't you help raise \$1.2 million to establish the Evangelical Lutheran Church Africa Mission in South Sudan? Working with local leaders and partners, including ELCA Sudanese congregations, the Episcopal Church of Sudan and the South Sudan Council of Churches, this initiative <u>supports the emerging Lutheran church in training leaders for outreach</u> and contributes to efforts underway to foster peace and reconciliation between those of different ethnic and religious backgrounds. <u>"South Sudan: A New Church for a New Nation"</u> is a priority of *Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA*.

ELCA Youth Gathering

Lutheran teens and young adults from all over the country made a good impression in Detroit, says this article from <u>USA Today</u>. Collaborating with the Women of the ELCA, attendees <u>contributed a million diapers</u> to the Detroit Area Diaper Bank, which distributes diapers to low-income families with young children. Responding to flooding in Colombia

Lutheran Disaster Response has committed \$80,000 and is working with The Lutheran World Federation to respond to the humanitarian needs of 30,000 people affected by <u>spring floods in the Arauca Department of Colombia</u>. Food vouchers, water filters, buckets and tank cleaning kits have been distributed to more than 3,000 families.

Nepal earthquake update

<u>Dalits, the "untouchable" caste</u>, are one of the vulnerable groups addressed by The Lutheran World Federation following the April earthquake in Nepal. Lutheran Disaster Response continues to fund relief work by LWF, Lutheran World Relief, and the United Mission to Nepal and will soon shift to long-term rebuilding and rehabilitation needs.


